Liz Cranmer holds a Master of Science Degree in Behavior Analysis, is a Board Certified Behavior Analyst, and has been in the field of autism treatment since 2001, providing services for children with autism in private school, home, and community settings. She is currently a Clinical Director at the Wolf Harbor Campus. During her time at The Connecticut Center for Child Development (CCCD), she has also served as Clinical Director of Outreach Services, providing in-home consultation, professional trainings, as well as mentorship for candidates pursuing their BCBA certification. In addition to her responsibilities in and around CCCD, Liz has

presented lectures and workshops on autism and ABA at local and national conferences.

Megan McCarron holds a Master of Science Degree in Child Development, is a Board Certified Behavior Analyst, and has been in the field of autism treatment since 1992. Megan has experience providing services for children with autism in school, home and community settings. She has worked at The Connecticut Center for Child Development (CCCD) since 1999. During her time at CCCD, she has served in various capacities. She started out as an instructor and is now a Clinical Director. Her primary focus, at the moment, is overseeing the RBT training program across CCCD's school campuses. Saturday, April 23rd - "Challenging Behaviors": Challenging behaviors can have a significant impact on the safety and well-being of individuals with developmental disabilities and their families. In this presentation, attendees will learn about the ABCs of challenging behaviors and developing function-based treatments. Case examples will include stereotypy, Self Injurious Behaviors, and severe aggression.
