The Summer Camp program served 19 children with various abilities ranging from Autism to Developmental Disabilities. Students aged 2 to 27 years participated in weekly outings, water play, cooking, language games, outdoor sports and many other activities that challenged them to have a happy and healthy summer.

AUGUST 27TH, 2017 – Tomorrow's Voices Win Al Global Excellence Award – Tomorrow's Voices was recognized for its services to the Autism community by being awarded the 2017 Al Global Excellence Award for Best Autism Treatment & Prevention Centre. Tomorrow's Voices was featured in an issue of Al Magazine with a feature spread on the work Tomorrow's Voices is doing in the community, which will reach the magazine's 108,500 subscribers across the world.

Professional Development – Staff took part in Dance/Movement Therapy which looks at movement to gather information about intention, attention, and decision making as well as completed a full day First Aid and CPR course. Staff enjoyed both trainings.



JAN 14&28; FEB 11&25; MAR 11&25; APRIL 8&22; MAY 13&27; JUNE 10&24; SEPT 9&23; OCT 14&28, NOV 25; DEC 9, 2017 – Saturday Social Skills - We have held 18 Social Skills groups since the start of the year on the 2nd and 4th Saturday of each month. The Social Skills group which runs from 9am to 1pm on Saturdays has hosted a number of children with autism and developmental disabilities as well as students without disabilities. The Social Skills group provides those with developmental disabilities the opportunity to work on social skills, functional skills and language skills while participating in outings within the community. This group also gives parents of the clients respite time to facilitate things they may have to do, while knowing that their children are being supervised by skilled staff and volunteers.

JANUARY 2017 – Tomorrow's Voices Host Nursing Students from Bermuda College – For a two month period nursing students from the Bermuda College came in to shadow our staff as a part of their placement program. This partnership with the Bermuda College allowed nursing students to come into the Centre to observed therapy and learn the techniques used to work with clients on the autism spectrum.
